



# River Parks *Bridge & Trail*

The River Parks Trail Enhancement is a multi-phased Crossland Heavy Contractors project that has become an area of increasing interest for the Tulsa community.

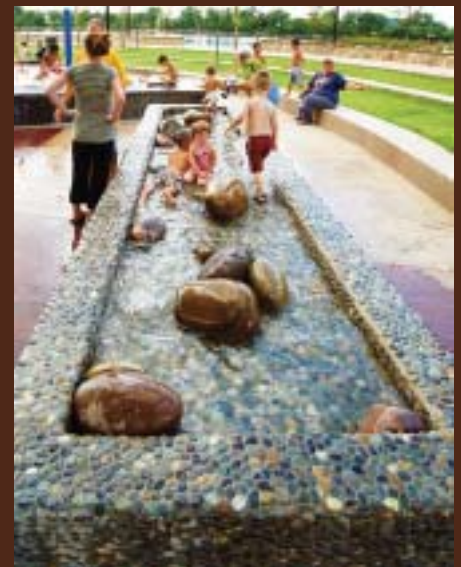
River Parks now includes over 800 acres of land stretching along miles of the Arkansas River. The improvements to the park were made on both sides of the river from 11th to 71st street. This area has become the park's focal point; with tree lined picnic areas, bronze wildlife sculptures, and native trees and flowers.

Keith Franklin, President of LandPlan Consultants, the architect for River Parks, had this to say about the project, "Land-Plan Consultants, Inc. has designed more than 45 miles of trails and greenways in Oklahoma, and we could not have asked for a better company with which to collaborate on the River Parks trails than Crossland Heavy Contractors."

The project includes areas that have been widened and others that were made

into dual lanes. The dual trails will help to separate walkers and joggers from cyclists, making the trails a lot safer. The project also added a pedestrian bridge and rest spots along the trail making it easier for travelers to stop and enjoy the spectacular views and riverside setting. The rest spots consist of new benches, enhanced landscaping, new lighting fixtures, fountains, and trash bins; all anchored by beautifully stained concrete.

The project is scheduled for completion this December.
